Final Reminder to receive discounted trees to plant this year!!!

As landowners who are part of a catchment group will receive priority in the case of oversubscription, we thought it was worth reminding you that this awesome opportunity is soon to run out.

Annette from Landcare Trust is running a Nelson/Tasman Tree Subsidy Scheme, but the closing date is at the end of this month (January).

Funding is offered by One Tree Planted via NZ Landcare Trust for tree planting in the Nelson/Tasman regions. One Tree planted is a Canadian based company interested in fostering more tree planting. They fund projects all around the world.

Annette has managed to organise a \$1.50/tree subsidy from OTP for up to 100,000 native trees that will grow higher than 2m, that are sourced from local reputable nurseries. The \$1.50/plant subsidy will be paid to the nursery on your behalf, and you will be provided with a native mix suitable for planting in the open for your site conditions.

Plants will be available from May 2023, and you are asked to have them planted by September 2023.

You will be required to provide a map to NZ Landcare Trust of where the plants are planted, within 1 month of completing planting. This map may be made public by the funder for marketing purposes. You will also be asked to provide a photo of your planting and provide survival data 1 year and 3 years after planting. It is important to plant trees in places where they have a good chance of survival, where you are likely to achieve >80% survival. When ordering it is important to remember you are committing to a maintenance period of between 2 and 5 years for your planting.

You will be free to claim carbon credits or carbon sequestration offsets on these plantings.

Landcare Trust hopes to have a successful planting this year and extend this funding for an additional 2 years. In case of over subscription, priority will be given to

landowners within newly forming or existing catchment groups, community or iwi groups and existing funded projects. The priority will be given to riparian plantings and plantings that will reduce erosion or generate other environmental benefits.

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


