Temporary Closure of Tapawera Community Centre OpShop

It is with regret that Tapawera and Districts Community Council (TDCC) will be temporarily closing the OpShop for an initial period of two months from Thursday the 22nd June 2023.

There are several reasons for this. Firstly, the OpShop currently only has one volunteer and whilst Margie's efforts are very much appreciated, she cannot handle the work load alone. Secondly, this work load is unfortunately exacerbated by some community members using the OpShop as a dumping ground for unwanted clothes, rubbish, goods and furniture. Currently, any income from the OpShop is being used to pay for skips and some people then add their rubbish to the skips! This is unsustainable and the situation has forced the TDCC to review how the OpShop might best serve the community in terms of selling quality goods and acting as a social hub.

What we plan to do whilst the OpShop is closed

Once the OpShop has closed it will be possible to sort existing stock and throw out un-sellable items. The latter will then be placed in a skip with a lockable lid! Volunteers are needed to help this process.

Once the OpShop stock has been reduced the TDCC plans to paint and refurbish the interior of the Community Centre. It may be that the OpShop could move to alternative premises whilst this is happening. This will depend on finding a suitable venue and having volunteers to run it.

The TDCC is considering employing a Project Manager whilst the OpShop is closed to help organise the refurbishment and prepare a new look OpShop for opening in the Spring......hopefully using volunteer support. Details of the Project Manager Position will be announced in next month's Informer and on Facebook.





Community First Aid Course a success

The recent community first aid course – which was a collaboration between Tapawera Connect and Neighbourhood Support – went really well.

People really warmed to the trainers and there was plenty of interaction and laughter while people learnt valuable skills.

The strong response to the course and comments I heard on the day indicates to me that this type of course needs to be made available regularly in our area. Hopefully it will become at least an annual event.

Neighbourhood Support works to bring people and neighbourhoods together to create safe, resilient, and connected communities. First aid training is an important part of emergency preparedness which is a key part of a community being resilient. So Top of the South Neighbourhood Support were happy to fund this workshop for the Tapawera community.

It was significant that most of the people attending lived rurally. Most rural people understand the importance of being prepared, especially as in many situations we will be on our own, hopefully only initially but perhaps for the duration of an emergency if you can't call for help.

One important spinoff from community events like this is the amount of interaction that occurs. This increases community connection but also progresses issues that benefit a community. In this case two people on the course came up to me to discuss AED (Automated External Defibrillator) availability.

Their point was simple – that given the significant increase in survival rates between prompt access to an AED versus CPR alone - there need to be more and we need to do something about it. which I agree with.

Emergency preparedness is a key part of the focus area about being caring and connected in the community consultation which is moving towards becoming a draft Tapawera community plan. This focus area will be extended and increasing the number of AEDs throughout the district can easily become a mini project in the plan.

Burglary and Theft Prevention Advice

Put yourself in a burglar's shoes. If you think like them then you can identify security risks around your home or your property.

The following tips can minimise opportunities:

- Lock and secure your doors and windows, including your sheds and garages.
- Photograph and record the make, model, and serial numbers of valuables.
- Consider engraving your tools and bicycles with a unique identifier such as your driver's license number.
- Consider installing sensor lights.
- Keep hedges and plants well-trimmed do not give burglars a place to hide.
- Check and maintain damaged fencing and locks.
- Note down car registrations and report descriptions of suspicious vehicles or persons - burglars often scope a place out in advance.

Tapawera on Two Wheels

TTW is a group of locals who ride together monthly in the vicinity of Tapawera. Those who come regularly enjoy the chance to go for a ride with others and enjoy a chat as we get out into some of the picturesque spots around Tapawera. Come along and join us!

My initial reasons for setting up the group were to provide an opportunity for locals who love cycling to get out and ride together; to try and encourage more cycling in Tapawera district; and encourage connection and active recreation.

The group activity fits with Top of the South Neighbourhood Support goals of encouraging and facilitating positive interactions between groups and people to build a sense of belonging and inclusion; and supporting healthy living, physical activity and mental wellbeing. This is why TSNS supports the group by providing free hot drinks where possible during or at the end of rides.

The hope is that in time we will offer a mix of rides to suit people right across the spectrum from beginners or those returning to cycling right through to experienced riders.

I am working on a ride list (including ideas and feedback from group members) so people can know ahead of time what rides are planned each month.

The rides are publicised in Local Happenings on the tapaweracommunity.nz website. Ride details may change but they normally start at 9.30am from Tapawera, usually on the third Sunday of the month.



From the Principal's Desk... Tēnā koutou e te Whaīnau ki te Kura o Tapawera

The term is already halfway complete. Time has gone fast. Reporting to whanau Teachers and staff are busy assessing students' achievement and progress by making Overall Teacher Judgements (OTJs) in Reading, Writing and Maths for Years 2-10. The judgments are reported to the Board (students are not named in this data) to help support strategic planning and the use of resources and finances. This information helps ensure we are using our resources and funding effectively. Then these OTJs will also be reported in writing to whanau in the interim report going out at the end of the term.

Our school policy is that students in Years 1-11 do not leave school grounds during the day without a parent picking them up and signing them out at the office or by a parent ringing the office and making arrangements to meet them. Students from Years 1-11 should not be going to the shop to buy food during the school day. We have provided school lunches or students need to supply their food. Please ensure your child doesn't need to go to the shop for food. This policy is to ensure the safety of students and we thank you for supporting us with this.

As a New Zealand school, we must provide our students with knowledge of te reo Maori and tikanga as the curriculum states. "The curriculum acknowledges the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi and the bicultural foundations of Aotearoa New Zealand. All students have the opportunity to acquire knowledge of te reo Māori me ona Tikanga." NZ Curriculum, 2007 To achieve this, we have been extremely lucky to have talented kapa haka tutors giving their time and knowledge to our students for free. They are working with Years 0 - 6 from 2 pm to 2.30 pm and Years 7-11 from 2.30 pm to 3 pm on a Monday. The purpose of these two 30-minute sessions is for our students to gain some basic waiata (songs) and Tikanga (customs and traditional values.) These are fun and interactive sessions that students can participate in on their terms. We want ALL our students to be able to confidently perform some basic waiata.

Our kura continues to focus on change and growth in 2023. As shared at the beginning of the year we have three main areas of growth that we are focusing on this year...

- 1. Math Pedagogy and Achievement Data
- 2. Positive School Culture through The 'FIRE' Way! (PB4L)
- 3. Attendance and Engagement Now we are six months into the year we are reviewing our progress towards these goals. See below...

Maths Pedagogy:

We have some teachers developing their knowledge and skills with professional development and supporting each other with lesson observations and feedback to support better teaching.

Achievement Data:

Teachers have made Overall Teacher Judgments (OTJs) for students in Years 1-10 in reading, writing and math. This is a measurement of how students are achieving. The OTJs First-day Term 3 17 July are shared with whānau in a written report that is due out at the end of the term.

This information forms a school-wide picture of how our students are achieving and helps the Board and Senior Management and Teachers ensure the right students are getting the right support at the right time, this also includes support for students who need more extension in their learning too. This information was presented to the Board at the meeting on Tuesday and is used to make the best decisions around resourcing and staffing. It is extremely valuable to now have this information.

Positive School Culture through The 'FIRE' Way! (PB4L)

We have reignited PB4L with The 'FIRE' Way! The expected behaviour matrix is now in all rooms of the school and each fortnightly we focus on a value and related expected behaviour. We have recognition boards to recognise students for showing the focus value / expected behaviour. We launch our reward systems next term.

Attendance and Engagement

Attendance is a national priority and like most schools in New Zealand, we are working to have our students at school as 'Everyday Counts' The aim is for students to attend school 90% of the time. We are working on our systems for monitoring attendance and engaging and supporting whanau to have students at school. We want our students to be engaged in their learning so developing classroom programmes that students want to be engaged with is a part of our teacher development. We have made good progress towards our school goals and look forward to continuing to make further progress in the next six months.
